2025 IN BRIEF

It has been another extraordinary year of growth with lots of firsts, as well as some challenges that we have had to take in our stride while keeping the ship steaming ahead. We welcomed 11 new staff, including three new international staff to lead our Secondary school and Boarding offering as well as strengthening the management in the Primary School. Our enrollment numbers reached almost 70, with growth in both the primary and secondary schools. We took part in a number of cross-school competitions and events and made our mark on the global stage - joining The Alliance of Sustainable Schools, the Boarding School Association and being shortlisted for an International Teaching Award by TES. We look forward to building on these achievements and continuing to grow next year.

SECONDARY SCHOOL

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We officially opened our Secondary School this year, having done a test run with Year 7 in 2024. By the second term of 2025, we welcomed Ms Megan Goodes as our new Head of Secondary which also allowed us to move away from Cambrilearn (an online learning platform) and offer all our subjects with in-person teachers.


In 2026, our first cohort of students will start preparing for their IGCSE exams which will be taken in 2027. In 2026, we will have 3 classes - Skates and Rays (Years 7 and 8), Lionfish (Year 9) and the Shark Class (Year 10).



CAMBRIDGE INTERNATIONAL

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In March, we gained our official accreditation from Cambridge International as a Primary and Lower Secondary Cambridge School. This gives us a global seal of quality, a network of other quality schools and access to a world-class curriculum. We will expand our membership to include Senior Secondary and an exam centre in the coming years. This marked the culmination of a lengthy application and approval process and was a significant milestone in the growth of the school.



Mental Health Awareness Month 20



OCEANS DAY

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Oceans Day continued to be the highlight of the week; this year we had two separate groups doing different activities every week. The Strand Cubs and Oceans Day students made memorable visits to Kelp Blue to understand the process of nurturing baby kelp in the hatchery and to play an ocean themed game of Jeopardy, they learnt about sessile species with a visit to Shearwater Bay to watch the dolphins jumping while identifying new species, they learnt about the life of a diver, they visited the Pescanova fish factory, the wind turbines, the Luderitz waste site, the Namcob penguins and enjoyed a special afternoon visit to Kolmanskop,. They went Hyena tracking with resident brown hyena expert Marie Lemerle, learnt how to surf with Mr Jakob and spent many fanstastic afternoons on Agate Beach enjoying the waves and playing on the beach. The winners of the Oceans Day jeopardy were given the chance to write their names on the Kelp Blue barge just before it was relaunched.



SECONDARY SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

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We launched our Secondary Scholarships this year to help us find some talented young people from Lüderitz to join our ranks while spreading the word about the school. The categories for the scholarships were Wavemaker for those with a passion for the ocean, Music and Performing Arts, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) and Sports. The scholarships were open to all schools in Lüderitz and the first cohort will start in January 2026.



GLOBAL OUTREACH

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We made our mark of the global stage, becoming the first school in Africa to join The Alliance for Sustainable Schools (TASS), becoming associate members of the Boarding School Association and being shortlisted for the TES International School Awards. Marnie Erasmus travelled to Nice for Oceans Week to share the Blue School story with other leaders in Blue Education and Lucy joined the Head of UNDP Namibia and James Mnyupe on a panel at the One Economy Foundation-sponsored Big Talk event.



KEY STAGE GRADUATION

Following the Cambridge model, our school is separated into Key Stages that divide up the curriculum. The end of each Key Stage represents a significant jump into the next phase of learning so these achievements were marked by an end of year Key Stage Graduation Ceremony. It was a beautiful event that allowed children throughout the school to be celebrated and to mark their journey from Starfish through to Shark.

- Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS): Reception
- Key Stage 1 (KS1): Years 1 & 2
- Key Stage 2 (KS2): Years 3, 4, 5, & 6
- Key Stage 3 (KS3): Years 7, 8, & 9
- Key Stage 4 (KS4): Years 10 & 11, leading to IGCSEs

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LOOKING AHEAD TO 2026

Next year we are looking forward to a growing secondary school with three classes and our first cohort of students beginning their preparation for their IGCSE exams. We will welcome two new interns in January with top-level experience in rugby and water sports who will help us with our extra-curricular programme. We also have a Marine Sciences teacher coming to help set up our Marine and Maritime Studies secondary programme and our Marine Science IGCSE offering. We will be appointing a new Sports Coordinator to be able to expand our sports programme.

We will be launching our first Biodiversity Camps - two-week programmes for schools to come and experience the unique ecosystems of Lüderitz, which includes some of the most pristine terrestrial and coastal environments on Earth. The visiting students will stay in our new boarding house and will experience the best of Blue education in a unique part of the world. This will help us to raise funds to help cover the costs of running the school and allow us to continue to offer a generous proportion of scholarship places.

This is just the first of lots of new plans in the pipeline as we grow towards our target of financial sustainability and putting the school on the global map as a destination for unique experiences and blue education.
