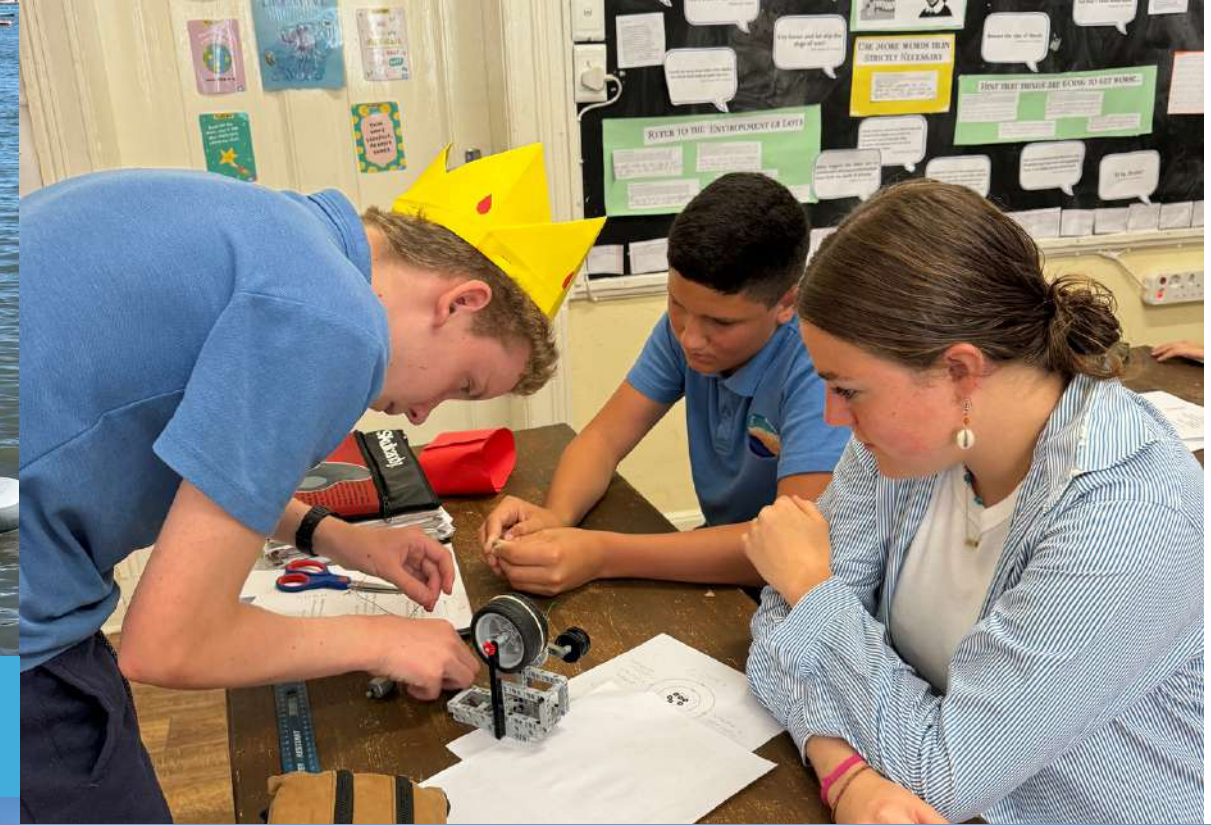
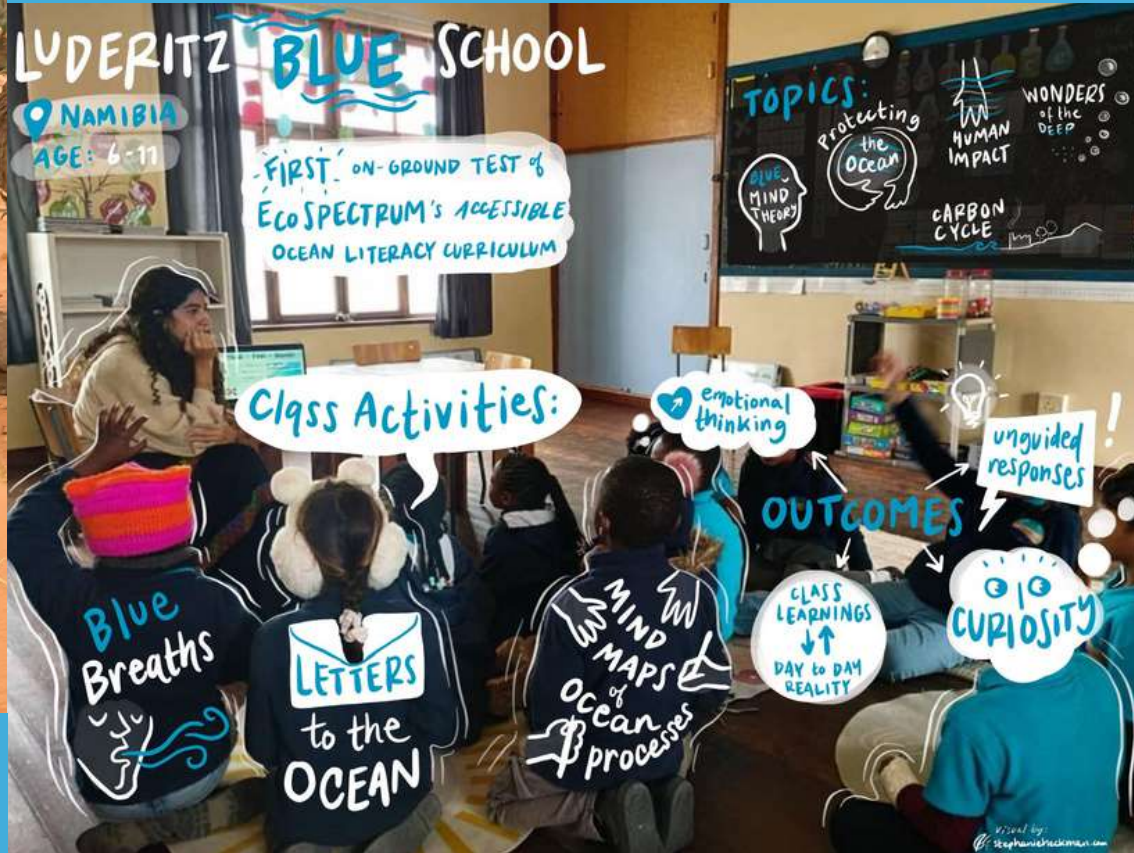

Example Schedule (3rd Term 2025)

16th-19th January	Arrive in Windhoek - travel down to Luderitz via Hike in Namib Naukluft or Game Drive in We Kebi
20th January	Intro to Luderitz / First day at school , onboarding and meet the team
21st January to 27th February	1st Half Term 1. 6 Day weeks Mon-Sat Teaching, Classroom Assistant, running Extracurriculars & Weekend (e.g. Sailing) clubs. School Day starts at 08:00 with academic lessons until 13:00 and extracurricular clubs until 15:00 or 16:00.
28th February - 8th March	Half Term Break NamibRand, Sosussvlei or Etosha Safari
9th March - 15 th April	2nd Half Term 1. Same as first half but with end of term concert / rugby tournament / other event to round off internship. Easter long weekend from 3-6 April is another opportunity to travel.
15 th April - 16 th April	Travel back to Windhoek and fly out.
