Seahorses

For math the children played skipping games while counting in 5s and used cubes to explore numbers through hands on counting.



Dolphins

We've had an exciting and productive week in Dolphin Class, including:

- Doodling 3D Sketches, Our creative sides were flowing as the students explored the world of 3D doodling. Using various techniques, the children brought their imaginative designs to life, showing off their creative skills.
- Building Sentences and Sight Word Games. In our language activities, the children practiced constructing sentences and engaged in a fun sight word game. This not only helped improve their reading and writing abilities but also made learning engaging and interactive with whiteboards and markers.
- In our computing lesson Mr. Matongo introduced the concept of algorithms. The students learned how algorithms are used to solve problems and complete tasks.

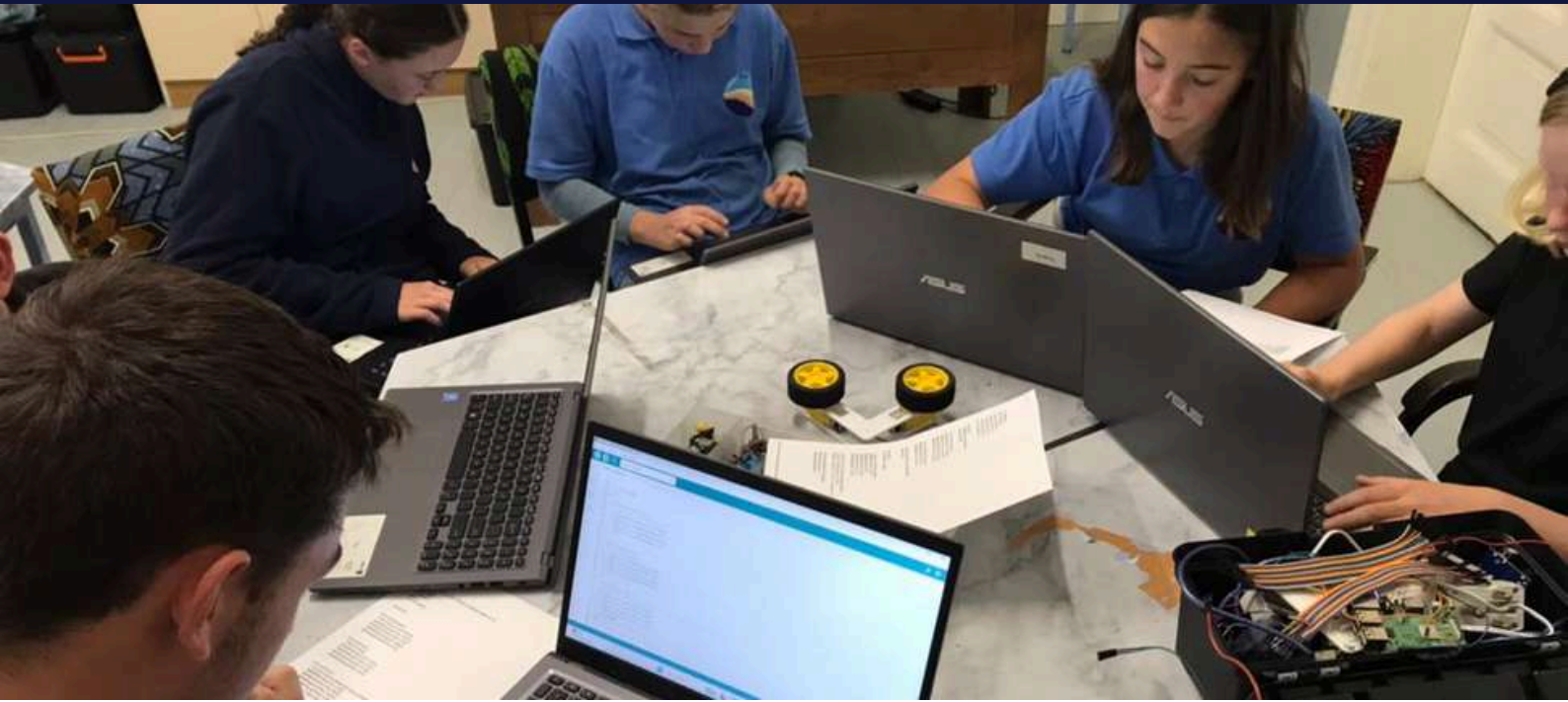
Sharks

And the googie gabs outdoorom.**

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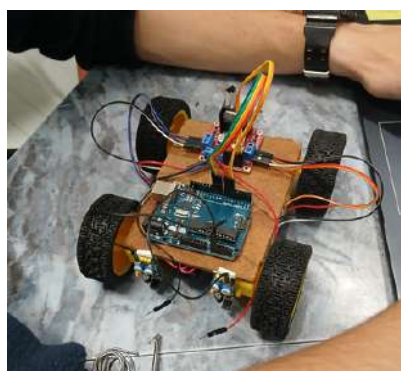
Oceans Day - Mr Matongo
